Employing groundbreaking archival research and a keen interpretive lens, Sudhir Hazareesingh restores Toussaint to his full complexity in *Black Spartacus*. At a time when his subject has, variously, been reduced to little more than a one-dimensional icon of liberation or criticized for his personal failings—his white mistresses, his early ownership of slaves, his authoritarianism—Hazareesingh proposes a new conception of Toussaint's understanding of himself and his role in the Atlantic world of the late eighteenth century. *Black Spartacus* is a work of both biography and intellectual history, rich with insights into Toussaint's fundamental hybridity—his ability to unite European, African, and Caribbean traditions in the service of his revolutionary aims.
